Dear friends and guests,

For the past two years, Voices of Singapore has organized projects that uplift the spirit of our nation and our people, organizing projects that seek to build strength and bring hope to all in the midst of the global pandemic. We've seen countless lives change and transform before our very eyes through singing. From our virtual choirs to our events and festivals that were held at beautiful halls, we've built communities around the vision that singing together can help unite a nation.

All proceeds from the ticket sales go to helping our community outreach programmes for 2022. Thank you for helping us to build a Singing Singapore. And our warmest welcome to the Pasir Panjang Power Station.

ABOUT THE CHOIR

Voices of Singapore Ladies Choir consists of semi-professional singers, musicians, teachers, as well as passionate amateurs who are eager to discover new experiences through music-making and developing a deeper understanding of the nation's cultural heritage.

Formally founded in 2014 as VOCO Singapore Ladies Choir by Artistic Director Darius Lim, they are the first independent all-female choir in Singapore. The choir has performed with Philomela (Finland), University of London Chamber Choir, The Coronation Singers, and numerous other ensembles.

In June 2016, the choir embarked on their first international European tour, where they travelled to give concerts in Amsterdam, Krakow, London (England), Great Rissington and Cardiff (Wales). During the tour, the choir was awarded the 2nd Prize in the Chamber Choir category of the 2016 Cracovia Cantans International Choir Competition in Krakow, Poland. The choir most recently received the Gold award at the 2021 World Choir Festival.

The choir joined the Voices of Singapore Choral Society at its inception in 2019 and was renamed Voices of Singapore Ladies Choir.

Darius Lim

Composer-Conductor Singaporean Darius Lim is the Founder and Artistic Director of the Voices of Singapore. He has risen to prominence in the national and international music scene with more than 40 national and international awards in choral and composition competitions. internationally published composer (Edition Peters, Walton Music, Pana Musica) and established conductor. he is most known for his unique infusion of lyrical, dramatic, instrumental. and theatrical elements in both the choirs he directs as well as his choral music.



Darius has adjudicated choral competitions, given lectures on choral conducting as well as conducted choral masterclasses in Asia, America, and Europe.

He has held former posts as President of the Choral Directors' Association of Singapore, Associate Choirmaster of the Singapore Symphony Children's Choir, Music Director of Singapore Eurasian Association Choir, and Music Director of the National University of Singapore Society Choir.

A former student of BBC Chorus Director Neil Ferris and Dr. Sarah Tenant-Flowers, Darius Lim graduated from the Royal Welsh College of Music & Drama (UK) with a Masters in Choral Conducting (with Distinction). He currently holds multiple hats in the music industry including Deputy General-Secretary of the National Instructors & Coaches Association as well as the nominated Singapore representative on the board of the Asia Pacific Choral Council.

Conductor-Pianist-Singer Joyce Lim is known for her reputable choirs and outstanding piano accompaniment skills in the Singapore choral scene. In 2014, all her choirs attained the Certificate of Distinction under her guidance and leadership at the Singapore Youth Festival Arts Presentation.

Hailed as "saxophone extraordinaire" by the Singapore Symphony Orchestra, Samuel Phua is a passionate advocate of contemporary music. In his latest recording project, he hosted a documentary 'Musical Soundbites' produced by the SSO which shines the spotlight on Singapore composers and demystifies the enigmatic instrument. He has performed as a soloist with orchestras and bands such as the Armenian State Symphony, Singapore Symphony Orchestra, Orchestra of the Music Makers and The Philharmonic Winds.

Alvin Chan Flautist, Orchestra of the Music Makers

Alvin Chan started playing the flute at the age of 13 under the tutelage of Wang Tong. Since then, he has pursued his passion for music and graduated from the Nanyang Academy of Fine Arts (NAFA) with a Diploma in Flute Performance. During his time in NAFA, he was awarded the Ngee Ann Kong Si Award.

As an orchestra and chamber performer, Alvin involves himself with various musical genres and styles and frequently performs with orchestras such as The Orchestra of the Music Makers, Musician's Initiative and the Braddell Heights Symphony Orchestra.

Alvin believes in spreading the joy of music to a wider audience. In 2018, he was invited to Ho Chi Minh city to give a series of piccolo recitals as well as premiering local works by Vietnamese composers.

He attained Masters in Flute Performance at the Royal Conservatory of Mons, Belgium under the tutelage of acclaimed Belgian Flute Professor, Marc Grauwels and was selected to perform with the L'orchestre royal de chambre de Wallonie as solo flautist.

Tang Ya Yun is currently a cellist with the Orchestra of the Music Makers and an alumna of the National University of Singapore. She began her music education on the piano at the age of four and subsequently studied cello with Zhao Yu Er.

She has collaborated with artistes of diverse genres, including freelance engagements with the Singapore Pop Orchestra by the People's Association, and has worked alongside musicians including Ron Korb and Soumik Datta during their various Asia tours.

Ya Yun has performed at concert venues across Austria, Germany, Malaysia, Taiwan, and toured with the National University of Singapore Symphony Orchestra. During her time in Germany, she was also part of the Junges Symphonieorchester Koblenz.

The Orchestra of the Music Makers (OMM) is a Singapore-based symphony orchestra established in 2008, comprising over 140 highly-trained volunteer musicians. Under the mentorship of Chan Tze Law, a leading Singaporean conductor and Vice-Dean of the Yong Siew Toh Conservatory of Music, OMM has become an integral part of Singapore's classical music scene and has gained international repute.

Matthew Shorten

Tenor

Australian-born tenor, composer, and conductor Matthew Shorten has been recognized internationally as a leading emerging artist. As a dedicated advocate for the choral arts. Matthew is on the artist rosters of the VOCES8 Scholars, Chorosynthesis, and the Taylor Festival Choir. He has performed as a soloist in several gems of the repertoire, most recently including Bach's St. Matthew Passion, and Mozart's Coronation Mass and Requiem. As a VOCES8 Scholar, Matthew studied with renowned ensemble VOCES8, composed a work that was premiered and recorded at Minnesota Public Radio, and co-led educational workshops for diverse school populations across the United States. A 2021-22 Luce Scholar, Matthew serves as a Visiting Artist with VOS and Visiting Researcher at the Tokyo University of the Arts. He received his B.Mus. summa cum laude from the Blair School of Music at Vanderbilt University, graduating first in his class as the 2020 Founder's Medalist, the university's highest student honor.



Alberta Wileo

Lighting Designer & Operator

Alberta Wileo is a freelance lighting designer and theatre artist. His lighting design work began in 2002 for Lasalle's dance graduation project. He has designed for many professional performing companies such as Arts Fission, Action Theatre, Singapore Repertory Theatre, Singapore Lyric Opera, Singapore Symphony Orchestra, Singapore Dance Theatre, HUM Theatre, Apsaras Arts, Frontier Danceland, Theatre Works, Singapore Philharmonics Orchestra, New Opera Singapore and many more.

He has worked with Afgan, a famous pop star from Indonesia, as well as well-known singers in the region such as Sheila Majid and Krisdayanti.

He has been painting the stages in Singapore and around the world - in Malaysia (Penang, KL, Genting), Japan (Tokyo), USA (New York, Maryland, Seattle, Washington), India (Calcutta), Indonesia (Jakarta, Mojokerto) and France (Avignon), among others, for the past 18 years. He is guided by his SAID (Selective, Atmosphere, Illumination and Dimensional) principles for his works.

This is his first production with Voices of Singapore and he would like to express his gratitude to Darius for the trust in painting this concert with light.



Daniel Wong

Sound Engineer, Ardant Studio

Daniel Wong is a music producer at Ardant Studio, with a decade of experience in the industry. He has produced songs and albums for artists such as HubbaBubbas, JAWN, lewloh, Vivien Yap, Shea Ng, and Valiantes. Recently, he mixed michigan/missinghim by lewloh in Dolby Atmos, the first full length album in Dolby Atmos by a South East Asian artist. As part of a band, he plays bass for Oakë.

Daniel is also a freelance sound designer and composer in the local theatre scene. He has worked with SRT, Pangdemonium, W!ld Rice, and Universal Studios Singapore on various shows and events, such as Tuesdays with Morrie (SRT), and Halloween Horror Nights (USS).

At Voices of Singapore, Gabriel works closely with the adult choruses, including the VOS Community Chorus and Ladies Choir. He also oversees the Starlight Music-Making Programme, an inclusive online programme curated for children with special needs, as well as manages venue hire relationships, partnerships and collaborations. He has served as Stage Manger for several concerts with Voices of Singapore, including We Begin Again (2020), When Winter Fades (2021), and Sounds From A Distant World (2021).






Mervyn Ye


Amelia Yeo
